



1. The Donor Conceived Register (DCR) is for donor-conceived people born from treatment in UK clinics before August 1991. By signing the form RFDC(V1) you confirm you are entitled to be included on the DCR.
2. Your personal data is protected under the Data Protection Act 1988. It will only be used in accordance with the Donor Conceived Register, will not be shared with third parties and only vetted members of staff of DCR or DNA Analysis King's College London will have access.
3. By registering your details with DCR you consent to passing on your physical and social characteristics to the donor and/or genetic half-sibling.
  - a. Physical characteristics are: eye colour, hair colour, style hair, height, weight, ethnicity, blood group and any specific physical characteristics you've shared on form RFDC(V1).
  - b. Social characteristics are: marital status, education, profession and any other specific social characteristics you've shared on form RFDC(V1).
4. In form RFDC(V1) you consent specifically for further contact with the donor and/or genetic half-sibling.
5. If there's a confirmed match with a donor and/or genetic half-sibling who only wants to know about your physical and social characteristics or you have stipulated that you don't want any contact with the donor and/or genetic half-sibling, you'll be informed of the match by a specialist support worker. You will receive the age and the gender of the donor and/or genetic half-sibling. If the donor and/or genetic half-sibling has consented to disclosure of further information you will receive physical and social characteristics too. A report will be provided from DNA Analysis at King's College London that describes the nature and the likelihood of the match.
6. If there's a confirmed match with a donor and/or genetic half-sibling and all agreed to contact, a specialist support worker will contact you, the donor and/or genetic half-sibling independently and advise of the match. A report will be provided from DNA Analysis at King's College London that describes the nature and the likelihood of the match. All parties will be independently invited to state how they would like any contact to proceed:
  - Exchange of information/communication through a specialist intermediary support worker
  - Exchange of non-identifying biographical information
  - Exchange of email addresses
  - Exchange of identifying information e.g. name, address, telephone number, email address
  - Face-to-face meeting
7. You are responsible for keeping your contact details up-to-date. However we may contact you (with a maximum of once a year) per your chosen method of communication to verify the details are still correct.
8. As a registrant of DCR you have access to the private forum on <http://donorconceivedregister.org.uk/log-in.html>. None of the information on this private forum is for public sharing either online or offline.
